Each year we hope to recognize more athletes and continue to balance gender and era and cover the entire spectrum of sports competition throughout the decades.

To be selected to the Hall of Fame, a candidate must receive 75% of the votes from the standing committee. This committee is dedicated to recognizing those athletes who clearly displayed greatness on the playing fields while students at Los Gatos High School. We hope to continue the level of excellence that tonight's inductees typify. Our inductees will be recognized with a magnificent trophy. Their names will be added to the banner hanging in the school's gym and the Hall of Fame plaque mounted in the lobby of the gym will also be engraved with their names.

We plan to begin shortly after tonight's proceedings with the selection of next year's class of inductees. The guidelines established by the committee require that 10 years pass from graduation at LGHS before a candidate becomes eligible for consideration. We hope to make the announcement for the Hall of Fame "Class of 2018" at the Alumni Reunion Football Game the last weekend of October 2017 and honor the group at a dinner ceremony on the first Saturday in May 2018. Please relax, listen and enjoy the evening as we recount the accomplishments and feats of some of the greatest Wildcat athletes in the long and storied history of Los Gatos High School.




Iim was the starting halfback on the Varsity football team his senior year. Won the Streepy Trophy as the outstanding player on the Varsity football team. He earned seven letters during high school and was Block LG president his senior year. As a sophomore Iim lettered in 130s football and track and field, where he set the valley record in the discus. His junior year he was MVP of the 130 football team and earned a letter in Varsity track. His senior season of football saw him on the varsity where he was chosen second team all SCVAL as a halfback. Jim was also the starting center fielder on the baseball team.



1955 FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TRACK


Lettered in football his junior and senior years as an end making All SCVAL his senior year when he led the league in touchdowns pass receptions. As a basketball player, Jim was one of the most prolific shooting guards in Los Gatos history. In a huge upset victory over highly ranked Watsonville High, Jim shattered the school scoring record with a 39-point game. He had a 22-point per game average leading the SCVAL in scoring while being chosen first team All SCVAL. As a track athlete he competed in the high jump and broad jump where he was a SCVAL league finalist, twice tying for first in the high jump and finishing 3rd in the broad jump.



R.W. "Sandy" Atwood




Sandy was a two-time Colburn Trophy winner in both his junior and senior football years. He was the starting halfback on the 1962 WVAL championship Wildcat football team. He was an outstanding track athlete throughout high school and also played basketball. He ran a 9.9 100-yard dash as a senior, and helped the 4X100 Relay team win the League title that season. He was an outstanding hurdler who ran the 180 low hurdles for the Wildcats, again finishing first at the League Finals. He was also a member of the 4x220 League championship relay team giving him three league titles his senior season. Went on to play football and run track at Pomona College



Mark Frederickson


1977 SWIMMING, FOOTBALL, WATER POLO

Swam all four years on the Varsity swim team. Played JV football and was a two-year starter on the Varsity water polo team. As a swimmer Mark was the team leader and high point scorer at both the 1976 and 1977 West Valley League Swim Finals. In 1977 he led the swim team to its first ever WVAL league championship when he was All American, league and CCS champion in the 50 freestyle and All American on 4x100 Relay. He qualified for CCS in the 50, 100 and 400 relay both his junior and senior seasons. He became the first Los Gatos swimmer in school history to win a CCS championship, winning the 50 free in 21.5 seconds. Awarded the Panighetti Cup as the school's top senior athlete in 1977. Swam on scholarship at BYU and later UCSB.







In basketball Dave was a McDonalds All-American nominee and received ALL CCS honorable mention while leading the WVAL in scoring his senior season. He was the LG basketball team MVP both his junior and senior seasons. He averaged 23 points per game including a single game 31 point effort his senior vear - without a 3-point line. Dave was an All CCS honoree in baseball as the Wildcats top pitcher and sported a .456 batting average his senior season. He was named both team and WVAL MVP. Played football through his junior year. Went on to play baseball at West Valley College where he was the team MVP and after that played at Washington State.



1987 BASKETBALL, SOFTBALL

Played 4 years Varsity basketball and softball. In her freshman season she played on the Orange Crush basketball team that went 29-2, won the NorCal championship and lost in the finals of the State tournament. Her senior season she scored 306 points, pulled down 90 rebounds, had 91 steals and 51 assists while being named both team and league MVP. She was a three-time ALL Leaguer in basketball. Three year starting shortstop on the Varsity softball team where she hit leadoff. Two-time All Leaguer, 2-time captain and team MVP her senior season of softball. Was named outstanding Female athlete at Foothill College in 1989 where she again played both basketball and softball.






Travis was an all-league starting tight end, outside linebacker and co-captain on the 1991 CCS champion Wildcat football team. He was named to the All Santa Clara County team and ranked as one of the Top 14 football prospects in Santa Clara County by the SJ Mercury News. He was also ranked as a Top 100 football prospect in California by Cal-Hi magazine. As a Track and Field athlete, he was a league champion in the discus his senior year when he finished in the top 5 at CCS. Was the leading scorer on the Track team where he was named MVP while competing in 4 events each meet including the hurdles, shot, discus, long jump and triple jump. Went on to play 3 years of football at Cal Poly.




1993 VOLLEYBALL

Was an All-League and All-Santa Clara County volleyball player throughout high school. Maile was the first volleyball player to start on the varsity team all four years of high school. Named the Santa Clara County Volleyball Sophomore of the year and Junior of the Year. Was all league, all CCS and a first team All American while leading the Wildcats in assists as a setter her junior year. Her senior year she was Team Captain, Co-MVP of the league, All Santa Clara County and All CCS and was named to the Volleyball Monthly Magazine's "Fab 50" as being one of the top 50 athletes nationwide. Earned a 5-year full ride scholarship to play volleyball for at UC Santa Barbara where she became the UCSB career leader in assists.





Matt was called by Coach Harmatz "The best middle distance runner in Los Gatos history". 3-time CCS champion winning the 800 as both a junior and senior and doubling in the mile his senior year. He is the only 3-time CCS champion on the track in school history and finished 3rd at the state finals of the 800 by less than a vard when he ran the 7th fastest time in the nation. Three-time Track Team MVP -1999, 2000, 2001, winning the league 800 all three years. Matt ran on the 2000 State Champion cross country team as the #2 man. Three times cross country teams he ran on finished first in CCS. Named the cross country team MVP in 1998 and 2000 while winning 4 Invitationals and setting 3 course records.



2002 FIELD HOCKEY, TRACK

First Team All CCS in field hockey her senior year after scoring 18 points with 7 goals and 4 assists. She was First Team All League both her junior and senior seasons and her field hockey teams made the CCS Finals all four years. She competed at the National Hockey Festival all four years of her high school career. Named the Junior Female Athlete of The Year. In Track Lyndsay participated in the Long Jump, Triple Jump and 4X100 Relay all four years while at Los Gatos. She is still #7 all-time on the school's triple jump list and #8 on the long jump list. She was named the 2001 Track Team MVP and placed in the Top 3 at League Finals in both the triple jump and long jump all 4 years. Played 4 years of Filed Hockey at Stanford.
